

Family Poll December 2022 - Findings







Our purpose is to improve the lives of low-income families raising disabled or seriously ill children and young people.

Our mission is to provide items and services to all low-income families in the UK raising disabled or seriously ill children, that they could not otherwise afford or access, and that help improve their quality of life, realise their rights, and remove some of the barriers they face.

Our vision is that all families raising disabled or seriously ill children have the same choices, quality of life, opportunities and aspirations as other families.



Methodology

The data in this report comes from our quarterly Family Poll. The purpose of the poll is to better understand and track the needs and challenges families on low-incomes raising disabled children face.

Families were eligible to participate if they had not received a grant from Family Fund in the previous 12 months, and had not been invited to take part in Family Poll in the previous 12 months.

A random sample of eligible families were invited to take part. As a thank you for their participation, participants were offered the chance to enter a draw for a £100 Argos voucher.

The initial invitation was sent out on 7th December 2022, with a follow up three days later to recipients who hadn't opened the email, with a final follow up on the 19th December of parents/carers who hadn't opened either of the two previous emails.

This resulted in an achieved sample size for this poll of 1,055 families.



Who are the families who took part in Family Poll?




Who are the families who took part in Family Poll?

The financial cost of caring


2. Reduced incomes

For many families raising disabled children, parents and carers' ability to earn an income is significantly limited by their commitment to caring for their child.

"About how many hours a week, on average, does each adult living in your household spend providing help for or looking after your disabled children?" (n=1693)






a week **average spent caring** for their disabled children.

Family's experiences of working and caring

"We need more chance in employments and flexible hours"

"Employers not making it easy to work whilst being a carer. Carers' rights need improving. Carers allowance and earning allowance is too low" "I wish more jobs were family friendly so that I could earn an income around my child's needs"

"Raising and caring for three autistic children can be very isolating and lonely at times. My husband left his job in March of this year to help me care for them as I could no longer cope on my own. My physical and mental health was significantly affected"


3. Access to other care

Even when families would like their child to be cared for by someone outside the household this isn't always available. This further limits their ability to earn additional income.

Who, outside your household or an education setting, cares for your disabled child? (n=1,055)




Of families that responded had access to as much care outside the household as they wanted


4. Increased and extra costs

Many families raising disabled children not only face an income penalty, they also face extra costs as a direct result of their children's conditions and illnesses.




Increased and extra costs

Family's experiences of needing to spend more

"Ava* is 24/7 days a week care. We have someone with her at all times. Lights, tv, washing machine, tumble dryer and oxygen machines going all day and Night. We also have to keep our heating on 24/7 to keep our house's heating regulated so Ava is not going from warm to cold all the time causing her head colds etc"

"My child only sleeps an average of 2-3 hrs per night and often goes 72 hrs with no sleep at all. As a result of this we use electricity all throughout the night. He also has sensory lights plugged in all day and night. He also has no awareness of keeping covers on and pyjamas etc, which means we have to use the heating more" "We have to have at least 5 loads of washing a day due to bowel issues that my son has been waiting for to be fixed for nearly 7 years. We are hoping that this gets done this year as they have agreed he needs a stoma. Trying to dry the clothes is a nightmare. And we don't have the dryer on, but we are already at 600 with discount a month. It's scary times."

"My Son has several physical conditions made worse by the cold. Lights always have to be on as we are up through the night and he hates the dark. Sensory and calming toys and lights, washing machine and dryer on daily"

"He has muscle issues and cold effects him causing, pains, stiffness and shivering which can cause sickness and more. So I must keep him warm or risk him getting ill and going back to hospital"

Family's experiences of needing to spend more

Food allergies/ ARFID* means I can't buy cheaper brands/offers as he wouldn't eat them. His extremely limited palate means I often travel between different shops searching for the things he will eat. I can't use free school meals for same reason so have to pay for own packed lunches

*Avoidant/restrictive food intake disorder

My child requires a high calorie diet as her heart needs lots of extra calories just to function well, never mind to maintain normal growth.

Unfortunately higher calories generally equal higher cost, things that are full fat are often considered 'luxury' items.

"My child has a very strict diet due to his sensory processing disorder and will only eat one colour food and only certain textures and flavour"

"My eldest son, Alfie*, has had physical disabilities from walking and due to different physio treatments operations etc he is very tall, big build, muscles plus needs a low calorie healthy diet as he uses food when he is having severe panic/anxiety attacks. My youngest son, Ethan*, is medicated for ADHD and the meds cause appetite loss over 12 hours so needs a high calorie diet. This is very expensive especially with cost of living so high"

"My son is sensitive to gluten, allergic to milk and salmon. Gluten free and milk free is more expensive than normal food. Before when energy prices where normal I cooked lots, including bread, now I just do not have money for using my oven"


5. Benefits

"I'm so grateful for the help we get so I can stay home to care for them. Benefits, grants, support from social work, I am so grateful for it all"

> "If I could change something it would be the government plans to how its affecting everyone. It's so unfair to have these pressures on life when it could be easily controlled and more help could be available to everyone in need"


6.The cost of living


7. Savings


8. Falling behind

As a result of the financial challenges that families raising disabled children face, many struggle to cover their everyday costs and bills.

Family's experiences of falling behind

"Everything has gone up. I get paid and then each time I check, my bank the balance has gone down by so much so quickly, I am in a constant state. I'd worry about making my rent payment. Prices continue to rise which is so worrying" "Having to explain to my son why he can't buy lunch as usual or that he needs to take a packed lunch and setting limits on it that aren't enough to get him his usual meals. Or why there is less food or less healthy foods in the house. Or that he will need to wrap up as I can't afford the cost of heating or not have his electronic devices on as usual. Or reduce his shower time"

"Buying less food and paying bills late so I can put majority of money on gas, electric"

"Keeping warm and food, as we cannot always do both"


9. Going into debt

Where families cannot make any further cut backs, they are often forced to go into debt to pay for essential items and bills.




Going into debt

Family's experiences of going into debt

"Very tough.. Just have nothing left each month and getting into debt because of the cost of living" "Everything has gone up in price and I'm now in debt and I've never been in debt before"

"Debts, and worry how to keep food on the table and the house warm" "We are trying to manage our debt so we have minimal interest and charges. Hopefully in time our finances will balance out when we can work more reliably"


10. Going without

In many cases, families raising disabled children are forced to make sacrifices, and go without things others take for granted, because of financial difficulties.

Family's experiences of their household going without

"I'm on a pay as you go meter and spent 60 pound in a week on gas and it was still gone by Sunday morning, so couldn't have any heating until my carers allowance went in on the Monday. How we're getting through Christmas..."

"Going without food, heating etc. Being unable to fully provide for my children"


"Cutting down on heating home, wearing more clothes"

"Rationing heat. It's snowing here at the moment and we can't afford to turn the heating on"

Parent's and carers experiences of going without

"It sometimes my child eats before I would eat just to make sure they're full up before I even try food" "I go without meals so the kids have plenty"

"Just trying to get by using food banks when needed".


"Just trying to keep us afloat and our heads above water. The vouchers and food hampers we received from school have helped".

"I'm walking round in clothes with holes due to putting the children first".

Children's experiences of going without

"My children miss out on so many things because I cannot afford them.... They have never even been to see Santa because I can't afford to pay for them... Or swimming because I cannot afford it" "...child's birthday in December, then Christmas. He believes in Santa and doesn't understand why Santa cannot give him gifts"

We don't do family things i.e. cinemas anymore. We don't do days out full stop other than to the park, but it's now too cold.

"We have to cut back on things and outings that we used to enjoy as a family"


11. Disabled children

12. Non-Disabled children


The health and wellbeing of many non-disabled children has also been negatively affected.

13. Parents and carers


The health and wellbeing of many carers has also been negatively affected.

Parent's experiences of the impact of caring

"I can't afford to have any time for myself either, and I've become very lonely and isolated, I don't feel like I can talk about this to anyone as I keep such a brave face on, I don't want to worry people. Life is very hard at the minute"

"My life has been on hold for 16 years. Along the journey fighting to meet or ensure her health and education needs has stripped everything meaningful in my life. This affects my self esteem"

"It's very challenging, especially a single parent. No help somewhere else. I feel left out"

"Being very unwell physically, and emotionally the past 2 years. It has been a real struggle .. and I feel mentally drained"



Parent's experiences of the impact of caring

"Am I sad? I think I'm falling at times cos of the cost of living and it's got a massive hold on us, yes. Has my mental health been affected? Yes."

"Mentally I have been overwhelmed most of the time. I'm a single mother and I'm the only one who looks after him. Is not easy to find time for myself."

"I am struggling, I am stressed, I am worried, crying again and again, but I am not letting my feelings to affect my child. So....positive or negative we have to go forward"

"How lonely it really is. You discover emotions you didn't even no you had. My mental health is so low coz you take your self away from The world"



Parent's experiences of the impact of caring

"I'm a single adult with an ASD child. Even her school didn't quite understand how, while my daughter was in isolation, I couldn't go out to shops etc. They couldn't quite understand that I am very isolated and have no family support (family lives 40minutes away, are elderly and vulnerable themselves, and are somewhat apprehensive of my daughter and her behaviour). So, a lack of understanding, not of my daughter's ASD itself, but of our situation"

"its hard work especially as I myself am registered as disabled and there doesn't seem to be enough help out there when one parent is disabled, the other a full time carer of us all"

"It as been do difficult as I had a bleed on the brain and I am very poorly and looking after my daughter and 3 children the best I can" "My anxiety and epilepsy have been deeply affected and I have been isolated due to inability and costs of getting carers. Also lack of support from family and friends"
